



Our Mission and Purpose

Hudson County Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) is an independent, non-profit organization committed to advocating for the best interests of abused and neglected children. CASA works through trained community volunteers to ensure that needed services and assistance are made available to children to enhance their quality of life while helping to move them toward safe and permanent homes. Our volunteers each serve as "a child's voice in court" making recommendations to family court judges that are in the best interest of the child.

CASA's purpose is to improve the well-being and future outcomes of foster children through the advocacy of its committed volunteers.



Foster children with CASA advocates are:

- more likely to be placed in permanent homes
- will spend less time in foster care
- receive more services compared to children without an advocate
- do better academically with fewer behavioral issues than foster children without a CASA volunteer

The Children We Helped


CASA only serves children in out of home placement, who have been abused and neglected.

CELEBRATE CASA































My name is **Matt Hawkins** and I have been a Hudson County CASA volunteer for the past 6 years. I am honored to be able to share my CASA story and how I became involved with this amazing organization.

During the Fall of 2016, I began feeling unfulfilled in my career and that I had a responsibility to do more for my community. I knew that my work schedule allowed me to find time to volunteer, but I didn't know where to start, so I started with a simple Google search and stumbled upon CASA. At first glance, I thought that the purpose of CASA was excellent, but I did not think I would be able to manage the responsibilities that came with helping kids in Foster Care. I kept



searching and found some great organizations, but I somehow always ended up back at the Hudson County CASA website.

Throughout the past six years at CASA, I have had the privilege of being a volunteer on four different cases for young men ranging in age from 7 to 21. Before starting my first case assignment, I remember being very nervous and hoping that I could make a positive impact on the child's life. While each CASA case differs in many ways, there are some commonalities that I've discovered across all the cases I've seen. Each case features a child who ended up in a bad situation at no fault of their own and are now trying to navigate life through a multitude of challenges that no child should have to worry about.


One of my favorite aspects about CASA is that once a case closes, I am still afforded the opportunity to stay in touch with the children who I previously advocated for. In one of my most challenging cases, I was the advocate for a 19-year-old teenager who was set to age out of the foster care system by the time he turned 21. That meant we had two years to come up with a plan to ensure he was able to live independently and grow into a contributing member of society. Throughout those two years, I was able to help him get re-enrolled in a trade school after being expelled, work to find gainful employment, and most importantly I was able to see his growth firsthand and watch him flourish in life. Fast forward four years later and he keeps in touch with me to make sure I know what's going on in his life and knows that I will always be available to help him when needed. My experiences with this case had difficult and challenging moments but seeing him succeed in life and not giving up despite his unfortunate life circumstances made it all worthwhile.

During my tenure with CASA, I've had many successes, some disappointments and have learned a lot about life, the family court system, and myself. CASA has taught me to be more empathetic, patient, and grateful for the opportunities I've been given. Witnessing the positive impact I've been able to have on the children's lives has been incredibly rewarding and continuously motivates me to keep advocating for those who need it the most. I can honestly say that CASA has made me a better person and I will be forever grateful for the opportunities this organization has given me over the years to empower others and make a child's life a little bit better.


